Howard Nixon was one of the leading experts on Bookbinding of his generation. His main focus was on English Bookbindings but he also published in other areas -- like his Exhibition ""Bookbindings from the Collection of Jean Grolier " I hope to have my review of this book up soon This current book is a summary of Howard Nixon's long interest in and thought about English Bookbindings The Chapters are From the Beginning to 1520 Gold Tooled Sixteenth Century Bindings The First Sixty Years of the Seventeenth Century The Restoration Period The Eighteenth Century From 1898 until the Beginning of the Modern Movement Index. Pages 115--124. The index is very full and very well done and gives access to a great deal of information There are 12 colour plates scattered through the text There are 126 BW illustrations This book is the distillation of Nixon's insights into English Decorated Bookings. For that reason it is a very important book This book is very expensive If you love bookbinding and can afford it it would be a very good book to own If your resources are less I would go for the Volumes on the Henry Davis Gift ( to the British Library -- Nixon's old work place) Volume One of the Henry Davis Gift are a series of important but very detailed Studies Volume Two covers Northern Europe with some 250 English Bindings of a total of some 350 plus -- see my review Volume Three is South European Bindings

with some 200 bindings and nearly 200 Italian Bindings see my review Miriam Foot wrote all three volumes. ( she edited this current book after Howard Nixon's death ) Unfortunately doesn't allow me to link you to the reviews Try searching Henry Davis Gift ( Mirjam ) Foot. ( Publisher ) British Library I think Oak Knoll did at least one Volume if not all Three You will get a wide exposure to first rate Bookbindings in the volumes on the Henry Davis Gift The Illustrations are of a good size and in high quality BW The volumes are collection catalogues and are written to let scholars interested in Bookbinding what the Henry Davis Gift contains A Binding by X on the basis of the following facts. I would date it to YY and it is similar to other works landed with X and so on. although this may sound intimidating unless you are well versed in bookbinding studies, there is still much a more average interested reader like myself can get from these volumes

Based on the Lyell Lectures given by Howard Nixon at Oxford in 1979, this lavishly illustrated book traces the decorated binding in England from the earliest surviving example, the St Cuthbert Gospel dating from a little before the end of the seventh century, to the beginning of the Modern Movement in the late 1940s. This book's emphasis is on fine binding in leather, with the styles and designs used for its decoration, and with the tools employed to effect these designs. This work is the first to trace comprehensively the development of this English tradition and bring together numerous illustrations of the superb bindings produced over the last eight centuries.
