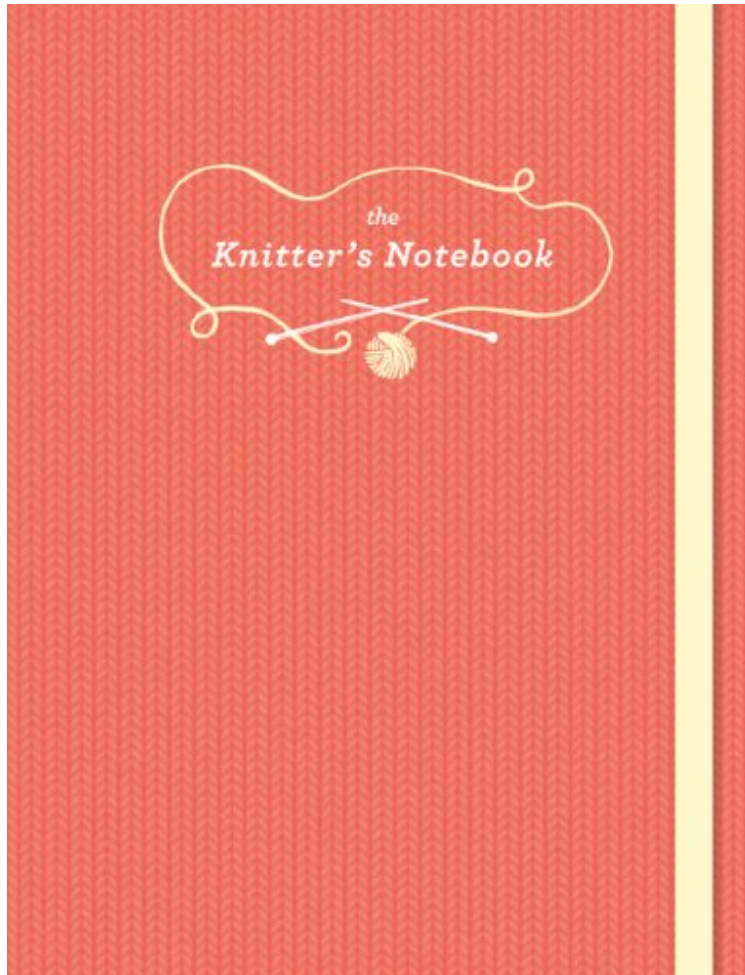

This little book has so much to it!! There are sections of it (Sizing guidelines with charts, How to Measure, Terms and Techniques and so much more). The actual working pages has titles such as for Project Name/Type, Yarn, Gauge, Needles, Notions, Key (for Knit Purl, YO, etc.) Measurements, Stitch Pattern, Chart grid and Notes. I like the grid/chart sections and the Notes area. The back pages offers areas for needle and yarn inventory, yarn weights, a section for family/friends measurements for any project being made for them and then more pages for notes and charts. The Knitter's Notebook is small enough to put into a tote bag along with your knitting projects. Great book!

I adore this little notebook. It has some wonderful reference tools like standard measurements and terms and techniques.

I love that there is a place to store measurements of family and friends that you frequently create things for. It has an inventory for needles, hooks, and yarn. The yarn inventory is a nice idea but I think Ravelry is a better tool to keep track of your stash. However, it's very useful if you use it to give info on yarns you have really enjoyed working with. I especially love the project pages. There's a place for almost anything you can think of. Every once in a while I have a pattern that needs a little more charting space than is allowed but that is easily rectified by either using 2 project pages or using the design idea chart portion to finish charting schematics. The notebook is small enough to carry around in my project bag and I rarely leave home without it now. I feel like I should buy several more for all my crafty friends and so that I can continue keeping track of all my projects even after I fill the first notebook up. Do wish the charts had larger squares as they are awfully small for filling in and too hard to read when you do. Full page charts at 4 or 5 squares to the inch would be much more useful. Otherwise it's a neat package to slip in your project bag.
