Information about fabrics, patterns, and how to match them up in order to actually make something. And finally how to sew using the machine. Straight lines, curves, corners, the whole bit.The next section, The Techniques, take you through hems, seams, straps, binding, piping, zippers, darts, pleats, and buttonholes. Really, everything you need is explained, with drawings, so that following pattern instructions will be easy peasy.The last part of the book are patterns. The patterns are very simple, and other than a cover for the machine, I do not think I would use them. But the shining glory of this book is not in the patterns, it is in all the other information.
