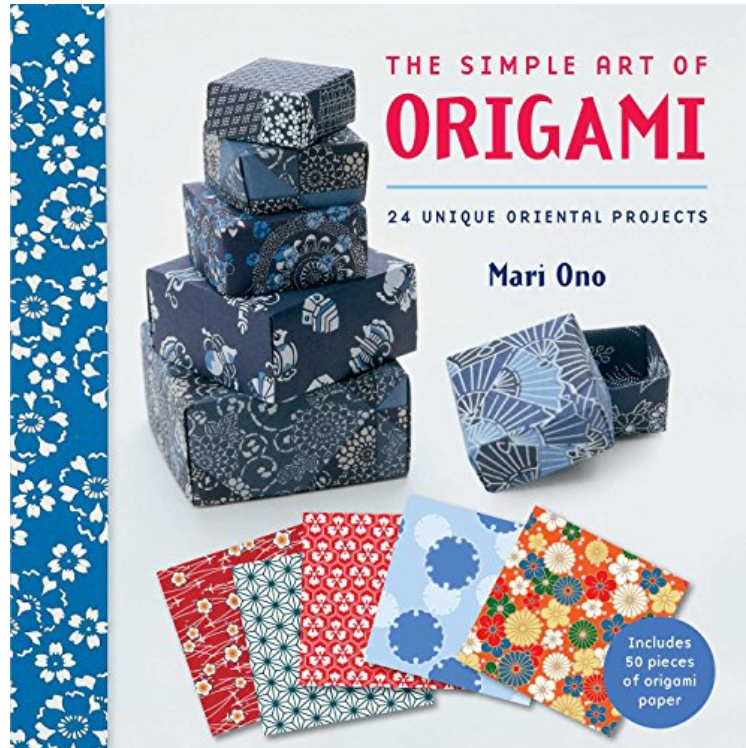

I need to learn to let him do the folds, as at first I took over too much. The book serves as an important lesson in following directions, both for me and him. You can't skip around and just the pictures aren't enough. At times I was tempted to look things up on YouTube but I never gave in.The book starts out with the history of origami and information on the different types of Japanese paper. It also provides some instructions on common folds you'll need in several of the projects. After that, you're presented with 24 projects, all ranked by difficulty from 1 to 5. Besides the difficulty level, at the start of the project is a list of materials you'll need, basically what size paper the project is designed for. Some of the projects require other items like glue or a protractor. To get yourself started with folding quickly, there is even 50 sheets of Japanese paper attached to the back in a plastic enclosure. The included paper sizes are 6"x6" and 12"x12". The projects have paper requirements other than those two sizes so you can't do all the projects without acquiring different sized paper, either cutting yourself or finding online.

I'm not even sure where I'd look locally. Overall, I like the book and the range of projects it offers. Surprisingly to me, my son liked it too and didn't appreciate it when I did a project w/o him. We'll definitely work on some more projects together until the paper runs out and probably get some more. I may have to look at some of the author's other titles that are more oriented towards children. I think he'd rather be folding animals than some of the projects here. He did enjoy the projects here, I just think he'd enjoy projects more geared towards children. Great job for the beginning with plenty of more difficult projects as you get more comfortable with the projects.
