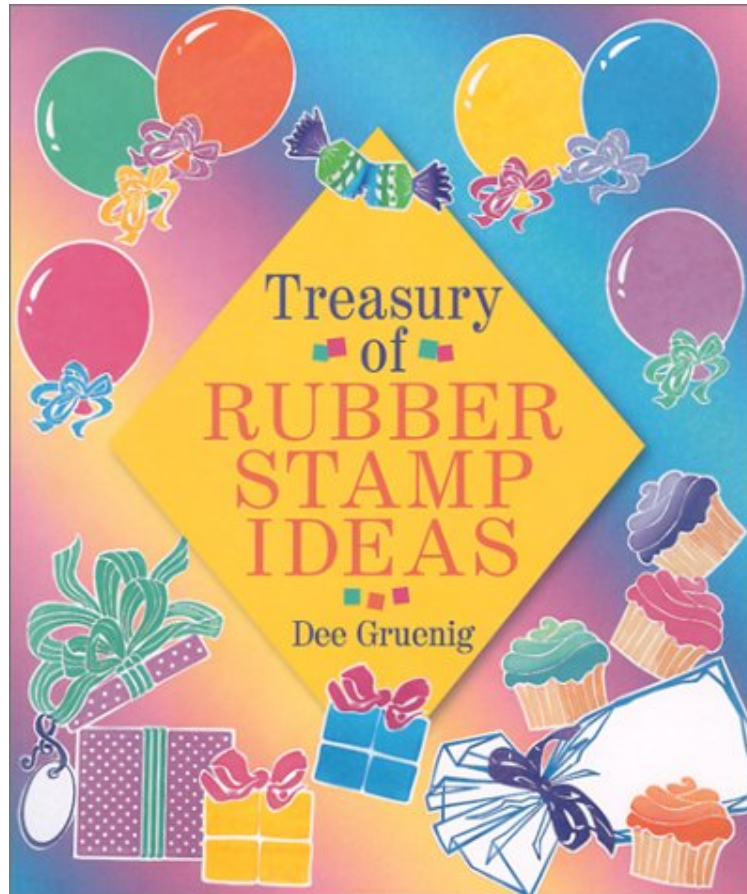

The 'Renoir of Rubber'By ealovittThis is one of the more unusual rubber stamping books I've encountered, in that it concentrates on stamped, decorated envelopes, with a sideline in wrapping paper, and a few picture frames thrown in for variety. Ideas in the treasury could be used for greeting cards or scrapbook pages that frame photographs of loved ones. Some of them are quite cute if you happen to have the necessary stamps.I do love the author's self-proclaimed nickname, which is the 'Renoir of Rubber.' That could mean a lot of different things to different folks.The stamping basics are presented first and would be a good review for even advanced crafters. I like the way the author uses brayers for her backgrounds, including a 'sponge brayer' which I had never seen before. It produces some remarkable watercolor effects. She also uses different types of sponges, e.g. compressed and wedged for producing backgrounds (perhaps she is also known as the 'Seurat of Sponges.')

Other than Ms. Gruenig's work with background presentations, I didn't find very much to interest me in "Treasury of Rubber Stamp Ideas." Most of the projects require special rubber stamps and I wasn't really inspired enough to go out and buy

them. The notion of decorating envelopes to be sent through snail mail seems like a waste of time. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
