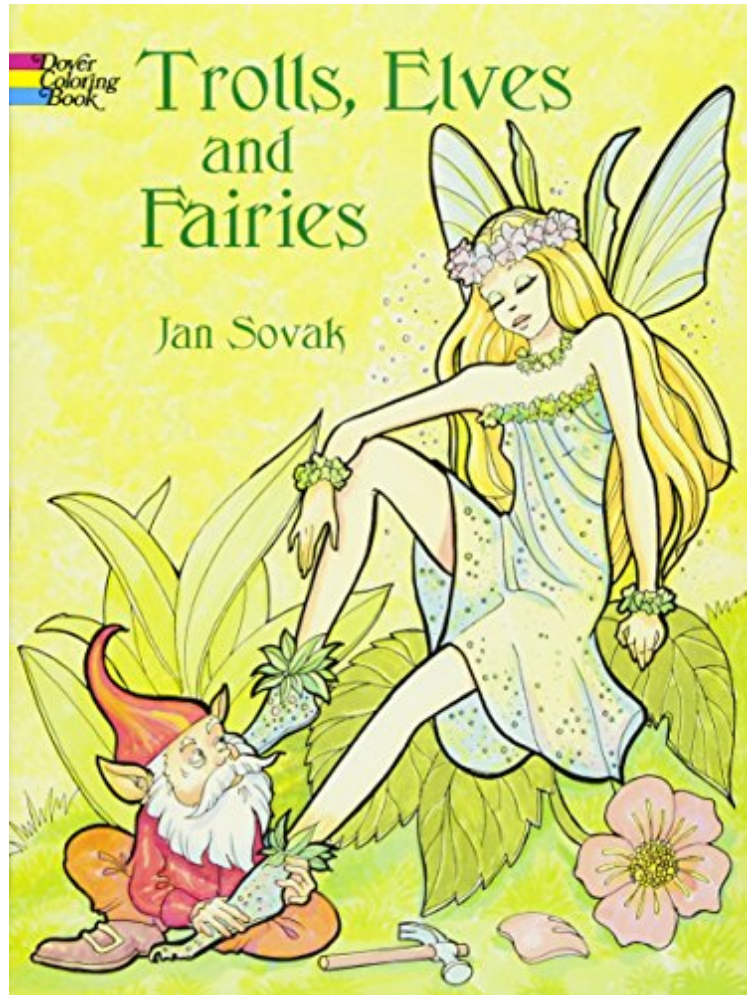

In addition to mermaids, leprechauns, and other familiar creatures, these 29 images encompass a variety of lesser-known spirits: Befana, a good house-fairy from Italy, who brings toys and sweets on Twelfth Night Sandman, an English nursery spirit who lulls the children to sleep by sprinkling magical dust in their eyes Puddlefoot, the Scottish household brownie who both tidies up unfinished work and makes a mess of completed chores The Cloud People, spirits believed by Pueblo Indians to bring water to crops Alberich, the dwarf king, who possesses a magic ring, a cloak of invisibility, and a sword with special powers Mab, Empress of Fairies, who rides a magical coach drawn by three butterflies Colorists of all ages are certain to fall under the spell of these beguiling images.
