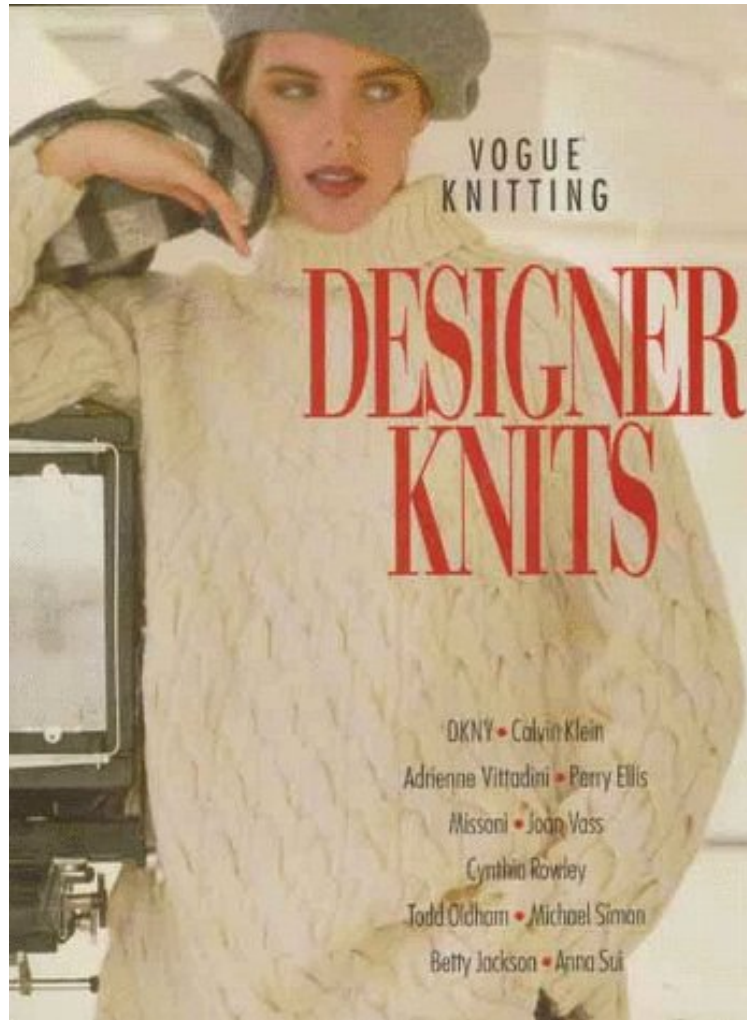

The one thing I don't like about this is the fact that some of the styles use

shoulder pads which are no longer in "vogue". The patterns would have to be altered to change that. Most of the patterns are usable as is, however. There are many elegant, classic sweaters and other garments included in this book.
