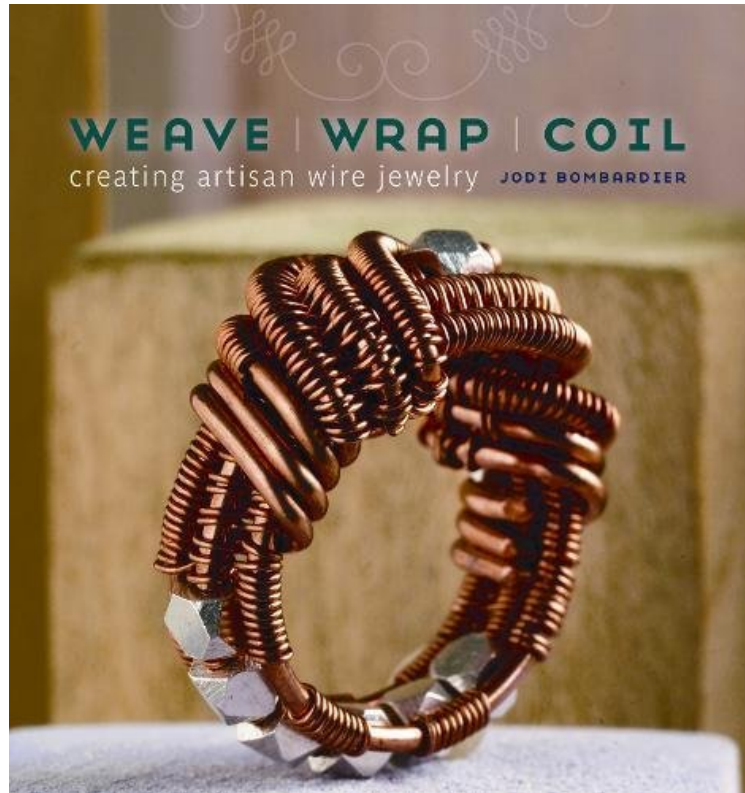

I have made almost every project in this book, and I have never done that before with any book. The instructions are so clear and easy to follow that I began this book somewhere between a Beginner and an Intermediate and ended up doing Advanced projects...not only in this book, but in other books as well. This shows many wire-working techniques and is so thorough that it shows FIVE wire weaving patterns alone! I do disagree with the author that the Diamond Pendant on page 23 is a Beginner project...it was very difficult to do. The projects are beautiful. They begin with a complete Materials List and Tools you will need, plus what techniques will be used! There are project notes before you begin that give you hints and tips. There are many detailed instructions that help you successfully complete each project. I can't say enough good about this book. Several errors in patterns, but solid book overallBy Crafty GirlThe first pattern I started doing, I found several errors in. I don't see any corrections published online. On page 97, in step 18 ,it says to turn the frame "upside down", however, I figured out that it really meant to flip it left to right (rotate it 180 degrees) to work the other side, not upside down or you'd run out of wire. Further, it asks you to create a coil in step 19 but gives no further instructions on how to use it. I figured out what it was for, but

it would have been helpful to see a complete diagram of the piece up to that point before beginning the mandrel-forming to clarify the steps. I don't know if the other patterns have errors as I haven't attempted any other patterns. Overall, I do really like the book and many of the patterns, but I dock one star for the errors. This is my second favorite wire weaving book--if you like this one, you will really like *Fine Art Wire Weaving* by Sara Thompson. I can see myself doing many more of Thompson's patterns compared to the ones in this book. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Great book, poor editing. By Dancerhythm I love the design ideas the instructions are pretty clear. The only reason I didn't give 5 stars was that many of the measurements in the projects are incorrect, looks like misprints or lack of editing. If you don't look closely you will use the wrong lengths of wire really mess up. I don't think this is a book for beginners, you need to have a basic working knowledge of wire working to get the most out of the authors lovely techniques. I did learn alot, very good book.
