There are very few designs---all very basic. It's a "reprint" (actually a photocopy) of an 1892 article in a British "ladies" magazine, so there's no assurance that the content is a true representation of Hungarian embroidery. Several pages are devoted to how to do stitches, a few of which are on the unusual side, which may be useful to some readers.

15 Pages. The home of this work originated with the peasants of Hungary in the area southeast of the Danube river. There are detailed instructions provided on how to work the stitches, including the colors preferred to maintain the ethnic designs of the region. This is a wonderful study for any who love embroidery - finished projects include a book cover, a border for a bedspread, center for a bedspread, a chair back, a corner for a tea cloth, a fancy mat and a spray
