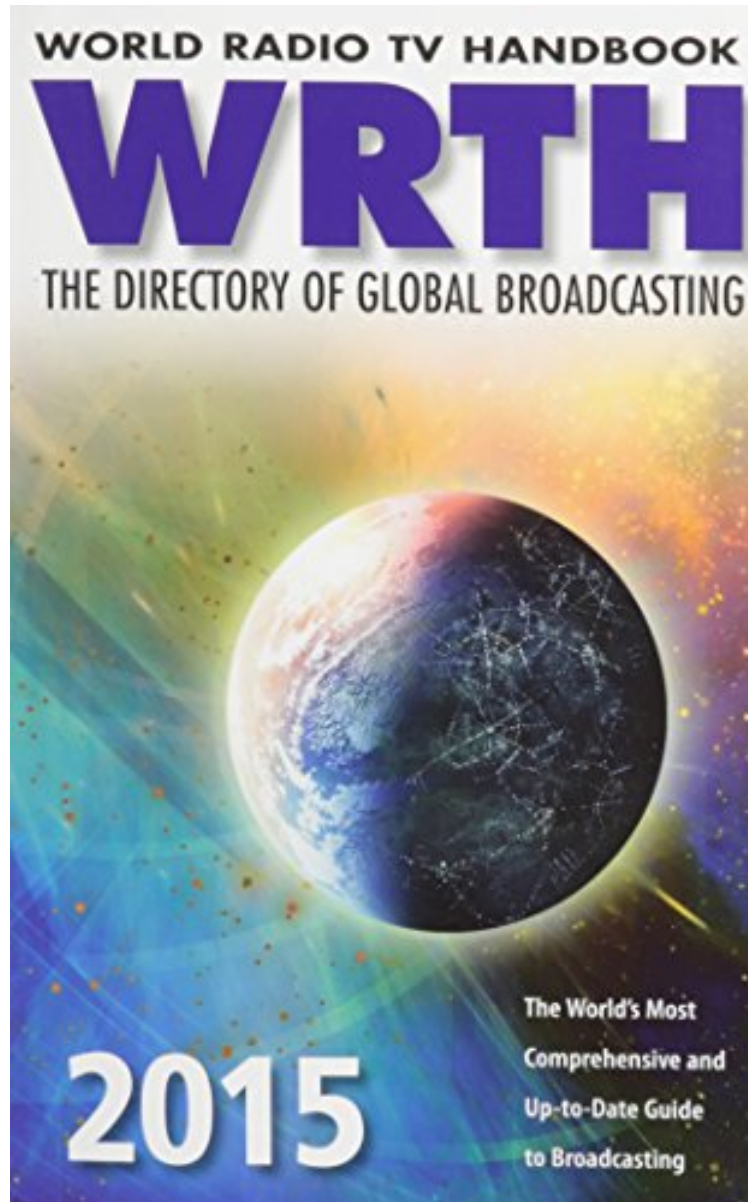

It has plenty of information that you need to get your LW-MW, Shortwave and FM DXing done. It has most of the AM broadcasters in the book, but does not have any of the stations that are 1 kW or less in graveyard frequencies like 1230, 1400, and other stations that use power less than 1 kW. It does have a good list of the European long wave, medium wave, and short wave broadcasters and FM stations for each country in this book with a lot of pages. The short wave listings are helpful, but it's pretty difficult to use and the stations are not based by the UTC time schedule. It does not list FM translators, boosters, or SCA-FM stations, just radio stations on FM that are based in the major cities such as Richmond, VA, and New York City for example. The interesting thing about this book is that at the end it lists groups and forums you can join via Yahoo!, but it does not list any of the groups based in Facebook. Above all, it's a great off line reference source when you don't have the internet available or if you want to be away from the computer and just tune in the world without depending on the internet for extra information.
